RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends adoption of Resolution 2023-2 authorizing staff to execute a grant agreement for a Proposition 1 Round 2 Integrated Water Management Implementation Grant with the Department of Water Resources (DWR) on behalf of the Antelope Valley Integrated Regional Water Management Group (AVRWMG) for this grant funding.

BACKGROUND:

The Antelope Valley State Water Contractors Association (Association) serves as the Grantee for Antelope Valley Integrated Regional Water Management (AVIRWM) grants and is currently fulfilling this role with the Prop 1 Round 1 AVIRWM grant. The AVIRWM group has selected two projects for consideration for the Prop 1 Round 2 grant cycle and those projects received an Award Notification Letter on May 18th confirming that the two proposed projects were eligible for \$999,898 of grant funding.

The Projects:

- 1. Palmdale Water District (PWD) East Ave Q Recycled Water Extension This project will enable recycled water to be delivered to PWD's planned Pure Water Antelope Valley Advanced Water Treatment Demonstration Facility with grant funding of \$587,578.
- 2. Antelope Valley Resource Conservation District (AVRCD) Lawn Reduction Rebate Program This project will fund 75,000 square feet of turf landscape conversion in the Antelope Valley with grant funding of \$391,786.
- 3. Grant Administration The grant award includes \$20,534 for administration costs.

A resolution for the Association is required to move forward with the grant process. This resolution confirms that the Association, as the Grantee, wishes DWR to obtain these grant funds and authorizes the General Manager of the Association, or his designee, to execute an agreement with DWR for that purpose.

WHEREAS, the State of California Department of Water Resources (DWR) solicited proposals for grant funding under its Proposition 1 Round 2 Integrated Regional Water Management (IRWM) Implementation Grant Program Pursuant to the Water Quality, Supply, and Infrastructure Improvement Act of 2014 (Water Code § 79700 et seq.); and

WHEREAS, the Antelope Valley IRWM Group selected the following projects to receive funding: Antelope Valley Resource Conservation District Lawn Reduction Rebate Program and Palmdale Water District E. Ave Q Recycled Water Extension, and

WHEREAS, the Antelope Valley IRWM Proposition 1 Round 2 Implementation Grant Application, filed by the Antelope Valley State Water Contractors Association has been awarded \$999,898 by DWR through the Proposition 1 Round 2 IRWM Implementation Grant Solicitation;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of the Antelope Valley State Water Contractors Association as follows:

- 1. The Association is authorizing that the proposal be made to the California Department of Water Resources to obtain a Round 2 Integrated Regional Water Management Implementation Grant pursuant to the Water Quality, Supply, and Infrastructure Improvement Act of 2014 (Water Code § 79700 et seq.).
- 2. The Association's General Manager is directed to enter into an agreement to receive a grant for the Antelope Valley Resource Conservation District Lawn Reduction Rebate Program and Palmdale Water District E. Ave Q Recycled Water Extension projects.
- 3. The Association is authorizing the General Manager or his designee to prepare the necessary data, conduct investigations, file such proposal, and execute a grant agreement or any amendments thereto with the California Department of Water Resources.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends that the Commissioners of the AVSWCA (Association) approve the extension of the Antelope Valley Fair (AVF) Conservation Garden Sponsorship by one (1) year, through December 2024. No further funding will be required beyond the original 2018 commitment.

BACKGROUND:

- The AVF Conservation Garden project was first introduced in July 2018. It was approved for funding by the Association for completion within that same year.
- The funding agreement was in three (3) phases, \$25,000 per year for (3) years for construction, with an additional \$5,000 per year for maintenance for 2021 and 2022.
- This Sponsorship is funded through the Association's General Operating Funds category, Contract Services based on member agency SWP Allocation %.
- In 2020, the AVF Conservation Garden Sponsorship was extended one (1) year, through December 2023.

Funding Summary:

- 2018: \$25,000 payment made.
- 2019: \$25,000 payment made.
- 2020: AV Fair cancelled.
 - Contract amended; payment delayed to 2021.
 - Original Contract extended to December 2023.
- 2021: AV Fair cancelled.
 - Budgeted, but no payment made.
 - Noted initial maintenance and signage deterioration.

- 2022: AV Fair postponed to Sept-Oct.
 - Budgeted, but no payment made.
- 2023: AV Fair scheduled for Sept-Oct.
 - Budgeted, but no payment made to date.
- Current Delayed Funding from Original Contract:
 - One (1) \$25,000 payment for initial construction.
 - Two (2) \$5,000 payments for maintenance.
